- Supporting connections between alumni no matter what school they graduated from;
- Creating opportunities for all alumni to come together for any number of reasons; and,
- To help encourage pride in today's students for their high school and a sense of belonging to a community of people with shared experience.

Some other activities we've talked about include taking on responsibility and creating a central repository for archives, artifacts, photos, and stories to preserve the legacies of each Flint school, perhaps creating written and oral histories for generations to come.

The schools also need help in other ways such as restoring playgrounds and mentoring kids. We can serve as a conduit for volunteer opportunities and we may find projects we wish to adopt.

We know this isn't for everyone and that not everyone had a good high school experience, but maybe, with your involvement and effort, we can change that going forward for today's students.
